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4.4% of U.S. HOUSEHOLDS – OR 5 MILLION HOMES – STILL UNPREPARED FOR THE SWITCH TO DIGITAL TELEVISION

Albuquerque-Santa Fe Least-Prepared Local Metered Market; Hartford & New Haven Most-Prepared Market

NEW YORK, NY February 18, 2009 – More than 5 million U.S. households – or 4.4 percent of all homes -- are not ready for the upcoming transition to all-digital broadcasting and would be unable to receive any television programming at all if the transition occurred today, [The Nielsen Company](#) reported today. This is an improvement of more than 800,000 homes since Nielsen reported readiness status at the beginning of February.

Under government-mandated action, all television stations are required to switch to digital programming by June 12, 2009, which will leave viewers without a television signal unless they purchase digital television sets, connect to cable, satellite, and alternate delivery systems or purchase a converter box.

Nielsen is making these estimates available as a public service to the television industry, government policy-makers and local communities. This information is based on the same national and local television ratings samples that are used to generate national and local television ratings. To conduct the survey, Nielsen representatives observed and tabulated the actual televisions used in its samples. Because Nielsen has developed samples that reflect the total U.S. population including African American and Hispanic populations, these household characteristics in the samples can be projected to the whole country.

Local Market Rankings



Among the 56 local markets that Nielsen measures with electronic meters, the one that is least ready is Albuquerque-Santa Fe, with 11.7% of the households completely unready. The most prepared market is Hartford & New Haven, with only 1.2% of homes unready. Both markets held these positions in January and at the beginning of February.
